Hello all. As some of you are aware for the last 18 months I've been a Body Shop at Home Consultant. We all know The Body Shop and The Body Shop at Home is Against Animal Testing and does some fabulous products, but it also has a pioneering Community Fair Trade Programme that is biggest in the world.

I am so, so passionate about this side of the business and am also very lucky to have been chosen again by Head Office to be the Community Fair Trade Ambassador for my region for a second season.

Here is some info for you on our Community Fair Trade programme. I hope it helps you all understand it a little more.

### What is it - When did it start - Why is it the heart of The Body Shop?

The Community Fair Trade programme began in 1987.

Sourcing quality ingredients and accessories from expert producers across the world and enriching economically vulnerable communities.

We strive to give our support and sustained trade to the people who need it most.

Our mission is to drive positive social change through trade.

### Who do we work with?

The world is changing and as a business we must evolve with it. We are focusing our efforts to drive real change and deepen our impact in communities where our trade will be most beneficial.
We work very closely with our 18 suppliers around the world and have a direct relationship with them.

We not only ensure these partnerships get a fair wage price like all of our other suppliers, but we also provide an extra wage, a COMMUNITY Fair Trade pot of money that goes direct to the supplier and cuts out the middle man, that the Community itself then can decide where it gets spent.

It could go into the business itself, it can go to schools, improving local roads in the area, healthcare centres....basically wherever the community feels it needs to go.

I could talk forever on everything Community Fair Trade as it is something I am passionate about and am so very fortunate to get to go on zooms with our suppliers from all over the world and here first hand from them. My highlights so far are talking to Milan Bhattarai from Get Paper Industry in Nepal that provides our handmade paper products, and Gaston and Lupe from Candela Peru that provides our Brazil Nut Oil straight form the Amazon Rainforest. I am super excited for the next 6 months as a CFT Ambassador.
